The first point of interest was the battlefield memorial site at Lundy's Lane.



In commemoration of the 1814 battle of the Anglo-American war of 1812. It actually closed as a stalemate as both sides were unable to continue due to lack of reserves, however it allegedly was a strategical victory for Britain. However it was recorded to be one of the bloodiest battles, with fighting taking place in almost hand to hand contact and unorganised skirmishes. Point to ponder why is the memorial site artistically beautiful when war is ugly?

Further down Lundy's Lane I had the first glimpse of the famous revolving tower restaurant, a landmark of the Falls since 1965.
